GREATER LINCOLNSHIRE ECONOMY **GREW BY OVER £200M** IN REAL TERMS

Local Enterprise Partnerships nationally continue to go from strength to strength with Greater Lincolnshire arguably one of the most compelling of the 38 across England. We have positioned ourselves strongly amongst our peers and Government LEP's commitment to ensuring it remains policy setters, and are leading the way in nationally important areas including utilities, food and water management, as well as setting the bar amongst LEPs in accountability and policy influencing.

Since the LEP's inception in 2011, we have established and maintained a strong strategic focus. This has enabled us to invest £307 million in our growth plan and bring forward 35 major growth initiatives. Whilst all parts of Greater Lincolnshire have benefited from these ambitious growth programmes and investment plans, half of these initiatives are within our five most deprived areas reflecting the LEP's ambition to drive inclusive economic growth.

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The LEP model has already demonstrated an ability to make key decisions which have tested the resilience of its governance structures as well as the maturity of local partners. As part of the fit for purpose and focused on its strategic economic vision and objectives, in 2016-17 the LEP has boosted Board representation from the health and care sectors and the small business community.

We've refreshed our Strategic Economic Plan, launched our Water Management Plan, delivered Big Debates, launched a range of skills programmes, expanded the business support offer through Business Lincolnshire, driven the development of our three Food Enterprise Zones, initiated a new Visitor Economy and Manufacturing Board, and made much headway with our place marketing and Team Lincolnshire toolkit work.

It is a great pleasure to produce the Greater Lincolnshire LEP's Annual Report which captures the progress we have made in 2016-17 and gives us time to take stock of our achievements and look at how far the Greater Lincolnshire economy has moved forward.

INVESTMENT IN GROWTH

The Greater Lincolnshire LEP has a hugely successful track record in securing over £307 million of transformational economic programmes across Greater Lincolnshire which has kick-started 35 major growth initiatives to drive growth, create new jobs and vastly improve the infrastructure.

E155M TOTAL LOCAL GROWTH FUNDING ACHIEVED TO DATE 33 TRANSFORMATIONAL PROJECTS FUNDED 2 FULLY S COMPLETED WAY This investment is also helping to support Greater Lincolnshire's 80,000+ businesses of all sizes, who generate almost £21 billion for the local economy, confirming Greater Lincolnshire's place as one of the most significant economies within the Midlands Engine.

This year we secured a further Growth Deal, bringing our total Local Growth Funding with Government to £180 million. The announcement gives the go-ahead for a number of schemes such as a centre for health science, which will drive growth, productivity, higher level skills and innovation; our three Food Enterprise Zones in Holbeach, Hemswell Cliff and Grimsby, creating employment land and buildings, specifically designed to support the growth and expansion of our agri-food clusters; and a £6.4 million Skills Capital Investment Programme to support the infrastructure to deliver high-quality skills provision within our priority sectors.

Our investments are paying dividends: and both the Boole Technology Centre and Bishop Burton College Riseholme Showground Campus projects have now fully completed and 18 further projects are contracted and under way. The first homes in our Unlocking Housing Programme in Boston are also ready and occupied and thanks to this success, the scheme has also been instrumental in developing new programme-based activity across other sectors.

The European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) has additionally helped to support over 17 transformational projects focused around our priority sectors, supporting activity in research and innovation initiatives; enhancing the use and access of ICT; making our SMEs more competitive; flood risk management; and protecting or restoring our environment.

Greater Lincolnshire has also benefited from the Rural Development Programme for England (RDPE), targeted at investment in business diversification, food processing facilities, rural tourism, culture, heritage and rural services. Businesses have received over £1.85 million of grant funding towards their projects and over £1.5 million of grant funding towards further projects <u>are current</u>ly being reviewed.

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HIGHLIGHTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

GROWING PLACES FUND

The LEP's £9 million Growing Places Fund, known locally as Invest and Grow, has made three commercial investments since its establishment in 2012, and supported 11 feasibility studies. In 2016-17, the fund started planning its fourth investment.



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In 2016-17, the LEP's Employment and Skills Board was instrumental in progressing several initiatives. These include the development of a robust evidence base for the Area Review, and commissioning £12 million of training programmes through European funding.

Through partnering with professional intermediaries we have been able to deliver high-profile professional events, including the Big Breakfast Export to China, Visitor Economy Digital Masterclass, Digital Conference, Build a Better Business Conference, and the Start Up and Grow Conference.

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HIGHL EVEMENTS

WORK WITH SECTORS

The LEP has continued to develop a programme of work, specific to sectors identified as key drivers of economic growth, ensuring that existing programmes support growth ambitions in terms of providing access to finance, support to develop leadership and management, innovation support and access to a pool of skilled labour.

Work with the manufacturing sector has been focused primarily on establishing a Manufacturing Board and conference to understand the impact of new technologies and whether changes such as Brexit have impacted on orders and investment plans.

Work with the food sector has been focused on influencing the industrial strategy and Government policy on automation, labour supply and trade.

Work with the visitor economy has led to the establishment of the new Visitor Economy Board, an action plan and work on place marketing.



In support of the LEP and partners efforts to raise the profile of Greater Lincolnshire, partners have continued to work with the Department for International

Trade (DIT) to respond to specific inward investment enquiries and to develop propositions to attract and retain foreign investment.

EVENTS

In addition to our popular series of Big Debates, our 2016 LEP Business Live conference attracted around 300 business people, combining talks by business leaders including Sir John Peace, Director of the Midlands Engine, and Steve Smith, Olympic high jumper, with our best yet trade exhibition which included a full-size combine harvester simulator, two FreshLinc articulated trucks decorated with local landscapes and promoting us nationally, the UKTI Export Hub truck, and the Visit Lincoln tour bus.

HIGHLIGHTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS



FINANCIAL **OVERVIEW**

£500,000 of core funding from national Government was allocated to the LEP for the financial year consisting of £250,000 utilised primarily for staffing costs, and £250,000 for operational expenditure covering company requirements, communication and events, sector support, and the implementation of the Growth Deal.

Our Invest and Grow fund held a balance of £5.773 million at the start of the year with a net spend within the year of £3.255 million. The Invest and Grow fund allocated a further £375,982 to the Feasibility Pot and this was launched in February 2016.

The Local Growth Fund held contracts to the total spend value of £235 million with an agreed grant contribution of £79.754 million. Within the year we received our further tranche of growth deal monies totalling £47.863 million, and distributed across the Growth Deal projects in line with projected spend profiles and agreed with Government.

The Greater Lincolnshire LEP also secured £246,000 of revenue funding from The Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) to continue the operation of the Growth Hub service.

We are governed by a Board of up to 16 private and public sector Board Directors and supported by a number of formal Boards alongside strategic and advisory forums. As the accountable body, Lincolnshire County Council retains overall legal accountability for the Greater Lincolnshire LEP investment programme.

We are transparent and accountable in all our activity. Overall risk to LEP activity and delivery of the Strategic Economic Plan is identified, recorded and reviewed at each Finance and Audit Committee whilst Local Growth Funding risk is robustly monitored and mitigated through the Assurance Framework and monthly meetings with the local Government representative from the Department for BEIS.
