3.	Update on BDUK and Broadband Project.	
	Justin Brown gave an update on the Broadband project for the Greater Lincolnshire area. He described the current challenges particularly the critical challenge of state aid. The support and voice of the LEP has and continues to be very helpful going forward.

	Herman gave an update on the work and priorities of the employment and skills board, and highlighted the work of a Lincolnshire partnership teen info that challenges perceptions of our industry in Greater Lincolnshire. They have produced a newsletter which wide distribution called Aspirations. This will be circulated to the board with the minutes.	Secretariat
	Herman updated the board on Talent Match, a Lottery initiative aimed at NEET's.	
	The SFA have regrouped and now wish to forge strong links with LEPs. Herman has been asked to sit on the East Midlands Board to facilitate this.	
5.	Presentation from Andy Baxendale on the Environment Agency - Key water cycle issues for sustainable growth in the LEP area	
	There was a detailed presentation from Andy (which will be circulated to the board members) concerning the complex and diverse issues of water management in Greater Lincolnshire.	
	There must be communication, debate and planning at a Greater Lincolnshire level, which balances medium and long term economic development with water management. Especially when sea levels are rising and investment in flood defences is being pushed by Central Government to find a local solution to the costs. It was agreed that this debate should be had with government, our local MP's and DEFRA.	
	Consider development projects that look at best practice in Europe -We need to look at technology and cross border solutions and collaboration for example look to how Holland has solved the issues. There may be European Funding available for such collaboration.	
	Lincolnshire is ahead of the game in terms of Managing water and has been working with internal drainage boards. Planers need to engage so that land is allocated in such a way that it is sustainable for the next 20 years.	
	There is a fine balance between getting the message out and about that Lincolnshire is a great place to develop business without shouting too loud about the risk of flooding.	
	There is a need to get the MPs of this GLLEP Area together to discuss the way forward.

The Board will remain as an advisory body and will not employ staff or have assets such as bank accounts, it is agreed that LCC should remain the accountable body as there are already adequate checks and balances in place as well as policies for procurement etc. The downside to incorporation would be the issue of VAT Liability.
