# Lincolnshire Resilience Forum – Recovery Cell Comms Distribution 8th July 2020

## **Headline Updates**

THE ANNOUNCEMENTS IN THE CHANCELLOR'S LUNCHTIME STATEMENT TODAY WILL BE SUMMARISED IN A SPECIAL EDITION TOMORROW.

Three key messages from the LRF:

- 1. "The Businesses and People of Lincolnshire should be applauded for the manner in which they are managing the opening of the public space. At the weekend, with pubs, bars, cafes and restaurants opening, we experienced considerable effort by most to ensure the safety of each other whilst allowing the economy to slowly open. We will continue to focus on helping our colleagues in business to open safely with a view to Lincolnshire NOT returning to another lock down as experienced in other parts of the country.
- 2. We need to remind the public not to be complacent; the 2 metre rule is still in place. The change is that where 2m cannot be achieved a 1 metre plus rule with additional mitigation can be adopted.
- 3. Businesses who are opening must continually monitor and review Government guidance. Whilst we will seek to support and keep our businesses informed, as best we can, we are reliant on our businesses in Lincolnshire ensuring they keep themselves informed, recognising that national guidelines can change overnight."

# **Business and Economy Updates**

#### Greater Lincolnshire to Get £25.8m in 'New Deal'

The Greater Lincolnshire LEP has received a £25.8 million cash boost from the Government to fund 'shovel-ready' projects to help the local economy and create jobs. The 'New Deal' announcement today is part of a comprehensive plan by the Government to "build, build, build", delivering upgrades to local infrastructure and boosting skills in a move to fuel economic recovery across the UK.

Thirty-six 36 LEPs and combined authorities are getting a share of a £900 million Getting Building Fund that will support local infrastructure projects to support economic recovery following the COVID-19 pandemic and will be used to improve digital infrastructure, support skills and career opportunities, and transition to a low-carbon economy.

The Prime Minister has also announced that funding will be brought forward for the six towns across Greater Lincolnshire to help them meet the immediate challenges they face owing to the pandemic.

This fast-tracking of investment totalling £5 million will help kick-start activity in towns and high streets across Greater Lincolnshire, ensuring that people can see and feel the benefit as soon as possible. Read the full story here.

#### £1.57 billion support package for cultural and heritage organisations

Britain's globally renowned arts, culture and heritage industries will receive a £1.57 billion rescue package to help weather the impact of coronavirus. The fund, which represents the biggest ever one-off investment in UK culture, will provide a lifeline to vital cultural and heritage organisations across the country hit hard by the pandemic and help them stay afloat while their doors are closed.
