Industry-Relevant Updates and Announcements

1. The future of the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS)

- As previously announced, the rules of the scheme are changing from 1 July and the Government will
 publish full guidance on 12 June on GOV.UK search 'Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme'. Webinars
 offering support on the changes will also be available to book online from this date.
- From **1 July** employers will have the flexibility to bring previously furloughed employees back to work part time and to decide the hours and shift patterns they work to suit business needs. Businesses will pay the wages whilst staff are in work and can apply for a scheme grant to cover the hours furloughed. The maximum number of employees employers can claim for in any period cannot be higher than the maximum number claimed for in a previous period.
- From **1** August employers will need to contribute towards the wage costs of furloughed employees until the scheme ends on **31** October.

2. National Business Growth Groups created

• Business Secretary Alok Sharma is creating 5 new business-focused groups to unleash Britain's growth potential and create jobs, as part of the government's plans to help the economy bounce back from the coronavirus pandemic. The fiver groups are; The Future of Industry; Green Recovery; Backing New Business; Increasing Opportunity; and UK Open for Business. Click <u>here</u> to read more.

3. Care Sector Testing

• <u>Test kits for care homes</u> have been offered to every care home for over-65s or those with dementia in England, reaching the testing target for 6 June.

Current Key Messaging

1. Face coverings in town centres and public transport

Compulsory face coverings on buses, trains, ferries and planes, and the new rules for hospitals begin from 15th June.

Businesses are urged to encourage employees to follow the guidance and people should continue to;

- Work from home if they can do so;
- Avoid public transport if they can't work from home and ;

- Avoid rush hour if they have to take public transport
