Coronavirus Headlines

Free rapid COVID-19 tests for businesses whose staff cannot work from home

Rapid lateral flow tests which provide a result within 60 minutes, are being made available free of charge to businesses to keep staff safe.

<u>Businesses not yet registered should do so by 31 March</u> at <u>gov.uk</u>, even if they are not currently able to open or operate, to access twice-weekly free LFTs until the end of June.

Those who miss this deadline you will not be able to register at a later date to access free LFT's so are urged to do so now.

51,000 businesses have already registered.

Companies in England with over 50 employees can register on to order coronavirus tests for their workforces. Organisations with less than 50 staff, sole traders, the self-employed, or members of the public, should continue to visit the local authority here for further information.

Legal footing for national unlocking set out ahead of vote

The Government has set out new 'roadmap' regulations for the next phase of COVID-19 restriction easing taking place on 29 March, which will begin to pave the way to the easing of all restrictions from 21 June. This comes ahead of a Parliamentary vote on both the roadmap and Coronavirus Act on Thursday 25 March. Further information can be found here.

Further £33 million COVID-19 funding announced for light rail and trams in the north and the Midlands

The Government has announced additional funding to support tram and light rail operators during the coronavirus pandemic, to ensure local transport is available to those who need to travel. This takes the total support for Nottingham, Sheffield, Newcastle, Blackpool, Manchester and Birmingham light rail systems to nearly £200 million. Further info here.

Geographical transition for businesses

The support that businesses in North and North East Lincolnshire have previously received from the Humber Growth Hub will be moving to the Business Lincolnshire Growth Hub from 1st April 2021.

The geographical overlap between the Greater Lincolnshire LEP and the Humber LEP is being removed. From 1st April 2021 North and North East Lincolnshire will be part of the Greater Lincolnshire LEP only and no longer part of the Humber LEP.

The advice and support for businesses will not change. In the majority of cases the existing business advisors will remain the same and we will advise where contacts do change. The current European Regional Development Fund programmes will continue to be delivered until the funding ends in June 2023.

Education, Employment & Skills

Funding boost for construction skills bootcamps

Over half a million pounds has been awarded to expand successful work programmes to help more people gain in demand sector-specific skills.

Skills bootcamps offer free, flexible courses lasting up to 16 weeks covering areas including construction, digital and technical. The courses are open to adults aged 19 and over and provide a chance to learn sector-specific skills and offer a fast-track to an interview with a local employer at the end.

The funding boost - which comes from the £43m announced last November to establish pioneering new skills bootcamps - will focus on developing test models that can be scaled to other areas. Further information can be found here.
