Teach Computing, part of the government-funded National Centre for Computing Education, provides professional development and support to schools and colleges to improve and enable computing education in England.

Expert computing support

We offer guidance and consultancy to schools and colleges through a network of experienced computing education specialists, called Subject Matter Experts.

These experts are available around England, and offer a range of support to eligible* secondary schools and colleges, including:

- Developing an action plan towards delivering GCSE computer science in collaboration with senior and middle leaders at the school or college. *A generous bursary is payable to schools that meet the criteria upon completion of the agreed actions in your plan*
- Helping to develop a longer-term vision and strategy for computing
- Identifying and addressing a school's or college's perceived barriers and building confidence and capacity for successful delivery of computer science
- Supporting leaders to identify a suitable curriculum model which integrates computer science into a coherent curriculum plan
- Supporting leaders in identifying teachers that can be upskilled through Teach Computing courses
- Working with teachers to get them started on their skills journey, identifying the right courses to take
